IS terrorist held...

The arrested IS operative had also made the passports made of his wife and four children. He said one pistol was also recovered from the terrorist. The pressure cooker IEDs were neutralised by NSG bomb squad, the DCP said. He said the terrorist confessed to the police that he tested the explosive device at his village a few months ago. "Later due to the COVID-19 pandemic, his movement was restricted. Around August 15, he had an intention to make an attempt in Delhi but due to security arrangements here he was not successful," added the DCP. The IS operative was also in communication with Islamic State in Khorasan Province operatives. Earlier, Prashant Kumar, UP (ADG Law and Order) told the media that IS operative arrested from Delhi has a connection with Uttar Pradesh. "The ISIS operative arrested from Dhaura Kuan in Delhi has a connection with Uttar Pradesh. The possibility of his other associates being active cannot be denied. Security agencies in the tate are on alert," Kumar said.

3 IPS officers...

Killer rains kill...

The deceased has been identified as Sujeet (40), a resident of Bhagirathpura area. He had parked his bike near Krishnapura Bridge. According to the police, he was heading towards his bike when an electric wire snapped and fell on him and he got electrocuted. It was raining during the incident. People of the area informed police about the incident and took him to the hospital where he died during treatment. A 50-year-old man died after he fell from his bicycle while he was on his way to his work place on Friday night. He was employed as a security guard. He lost control of his cycle and fell on the road. He received injuries after which he was rushed to the hospital but died.

Heavy rain lashes...

Budani and Vidisha recorded 19cm each. Hoshangabad and Udaainagar each recorded 18cm of rain. Tonkhurd recorded 17cm, Sonkchha and Bagli recorded 16cm of rain, while Nusrullaganj, Navibag and Narsingpur recorded 15cm of rain in the last 24 hours. Warning of heavy rain has been issued in Madhya Pradesh. 5 suspected Pak intruders killed by BSF in Punjab

THE CASE

The Border Security Force (BSF) on Saturday shot dead five armed Pakistani intruders along the International Border (IB) in Punjab and seized over nine kg contraband drug suspected to be heroin along with six weapons. Officials said the incident took place around 4.30 a.m. when personnel of 103 Battalion of the BSF spotted some movement across the fence in Tarn Taran district.

BSF HAS seized one AK-47 rifle with two magazines and 27 live rounds, and four pistols (9 mm Beretta) with seven magazines and 109 rounds. NINE PACKETS (approximately 9.92 kg) of contraband drug suspected to be heroin, two mobile phones, and Pakistani currency with a face value of Rs 610 were also recovered.

The BSF troops on duty noticed some suspicious movement ahead of the border security fence and launched a special operation. Subsequently, the BSF troops cordoned off the area and challenged the intruders to surrender but they did not pay any heed to the warning and opened fire at BSF troops.

"Hence, to stop their further misadventure and in self-defence, BSF troops retaliated with fire due to which the five Pakistani armed intruders succumbed to bullet injuries." All five bodies have been recovered

and the BSF has seized one AK-47 rifle with two magazines and 27 live rounds, and four pistols (9 mm Beretta) with seven magazines and 109 rounds. Besides, nine packets (approximately 9.92 kg) of contraband drug suspected to be heroin, two mobile phones, and Pakistani currency with a face value of Rs 610 were also recovered from the possession of the intruders.

Prime facie it is not clear whether the intruders were militants or drug smugglers as it is a matter of investigation, BSF Spokesperson (Headquarters) Krishna (Headquarters) Krishna told IANS. The official said they were armed Pakistani intruders and our alert troops of 103 Battalion fired upon them in self-defence.

"Our BSF men deployed on the border noticed suspicious movement of intruders violating IB. Upon being challenged to stop, intruders fired upon the BSF troops who retaliated in self-defence. Resultantly, five intruders were shot. Intensive search operation is underway," the official said.

Rajnath reviews China standoff situation

NEW DELHI: As India reconciles to having around 35,000 troops through the winter when the temperature is below -40 degree Celsius in Eastern Ladakh, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Saturday held a meeting with National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and the top military brass to discuss the situation at the border with China.

Talks between India and China remain deadlocked and now the bigger problem is logistics. India has to move around three additional formations to reinforce the border.

India has to build at least 5,000 habitats and construction in the inhospitable terrain generally stops in September.

Singh held the review meeting with Doval, Chief of Defence Staff Bipin Rawat and the three service chiefs on

the prevailing situation at the Line of Actual Control in Eastern Ladakh where Chinese troops are still camping.

"The meeting happened for almost one-and-a-half hours in South Block," said a source.

The de-escalation of troops at the Line of Actual Control has stopped for now as the disengagement talks between India and China have hit a roadblock. China has refused to move back from its present military position north of the Pangong Tso and Depsang.

The People's Liberation Army (PLA) has refused to pull back eastwards from the 8-km stretch it has occupied from Finger-4 to Finger-8 by building scores of new fortifications there since early May.

The mountain spurs jutting into the lake are referred to as Fingers in

military parlance.

China has also increased its troop deployment at Lipulekh, the place that became a trigger for strained relations between New Delhi and Kathmandu. Lipulekh is a tri-junction between India, Nepal and China situated atop the Kalapani Valley.

China has changed the status quo on the Line of Actual Control at various places. India has objected to it and is taking up the matter with China at all levels.

Both the countries are locked in a more than three-month-long standoff at multiple points, hitherto unprecedented, along the border.

During the meeting, it was also discussed that Beijing has started troop and material build-up in depth areas across the 3,488-km Line of Actual Control.

Godman unveils Reserve Bank of Kailaasa

BENGALURU: Absconding self-styled godman Nithyananda unveiled the currency of the 'Reserve Bank of Kailaasa' on Saturday. He announced on his official Facebook account that the Bank has offered its currency at the feet of Lord Ganesha and Paramashiva. The controversial godman had revealed the details of the bank for his newly founded country, in a video recently.

TMC leaders court controversy by cutting tricolour cake in Malda dist

Trinamool Congress (TMC) courted controversy after a video emerged on social media of leaders from Malda district ShehnazQadri, Sheikh Yasin and Krishna Das who are seen eating a tricolour cake at a public programme in Ratua. The two and a half minute video was shot during the 74th Independence day celebrations organized by the Jai Hind Bahini, a TMC outfit. The video has been widely circulated has drawn sharp criticism by the Congress and BJP as it amounts to insulting the Indian flag.

The Prevention Of Insults To National Honour Act, 1971 states that a person shall be punished or can be imprisoned for a period of 3 years along with a fine. The Act specifies, "The expression "Indian national Flag" includes any picture, painting, drawing or photograph or other visible representation of the Indian National Flag, or of any part or parts thereof, made of any substance or represented on any substance."

TMC leader ShehnazQadri is the cousin of Rajya Sabha MP Mausam Noor while Sheikh Yasin is the head of the Jai Hind Bahini unit in Malda district. Local TMC leaders are also seen partaking in the celebrations.

Nagaland BCC warns against Chinese cult 'Church of Almighty God'

KOHIMA: The Nagaland Baptist Church Council (NBCC) has warned the church leaders in Nagaland against a cult called the Church of Almighty God from China. The NBCC said this is a dangerous cult as they are actively spreading false Gospel and false teachings.

NBCC General Secretary Zelhou Keyho in a letter to all executive secretaries and directors of Baptist associations under it, said: "I am writing this with a grave concern concerning a cult, called the

Church of Almighty God from China, reportedly making inroads into our land. The Church of Almighty God or Eastern Lightning cult is a well organised group, aggressively moving forward with publications and creating many Facebook pages and colourful artwork that appears biblical and enticing."

The two-page August 19 letter, with the subject "Warning against cult" said that the cult teaches that Lord Jesus has come back to earth as a woman, named Yang Xi-

angbin, also called Lightning Deng, and the New Testament has been replaced by their new bible, called "The Word Appears in the Flesh".

"They teach that God is speaking through this woman, and they refer to God's speaking through this woman, as utterances, and these utterances are written in their books, as revelations from God, and they are being published and promoted through books, videos, computer generated movies and artwork and many

other forms of media."

Keyho in his letter, available with IANS, wrote: "Jesus said in His Word that He would return to earth, not as the almighty who speaks through a woman from China, but as He was, is and ever shall be. Let us beware of this dangerous cult as they are actively spreading a false Gospel and false teachings. Let us research them and expose them and take every measure to shield our respective congregations from such false religion."

Postponing NEET will be drastic deviation from academic schedule, MCI tells SC

The Medical Council of India has submitted before the Supreme Court that the postponement of the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET) Undergraduate (UG) 2020 shall be a "drastic deviation" from the academic schedule which "may affect the subsequent academic years" of the students.

In an affidavit filed on Friday, the MCI said the matter of overseas examination centres for NEET doesn't deserve the indulgence of the top court in view of the fact that the Government of India has permitted travel to and from other countries, through Vande Bharat Mission.

The affidavit was filed on a plea seeking directions to hold NEET at centres in Gulf countries.

UP legislature passes many bills amid oppn sloganeering

The Uttar Pradesh Legislature on Saturday passed around two dozen important bills, including the one under which rioters will have to pay for any damage to property, without any discussion, amid a din by the opposition which protested and shouted slogans against the government. Once the bills were passed, presiding officers of both the legislative assembly and legislative council adjourned the Houses abruptly sine die.

The two houses were to conclude the Monsoon Session on Monday but with the government completing its legislative agenda soon, Saturday was the last sitting of the session.

Assembly Speaker Hriday Narayan Dixit told PTL, "In all, 27 bills were tabled in the assembly and passed by the House. The average atten-

dance of MLAs was above 300." When asked how much time was taken in the passage of the bills, Dixit said, "It took 60 to 90 minutes".

Soon after the House met and paid tributes to two of its former members Vivek Singh and Kunwar Bahadur Misra, the opposition members trooped into the Well of the House, shouting slogans and holding banners to lodge their protests over law and order, the government's handling of coronavirus pandemic and floods in the state. The government drew flak from the opposition for hurrying to get over two dozen bills passed. The House took up its business agenda, allowing the government to table 27 bills and get them passed in over an hour without any discussion with opposition members who continued their protest in the Well of the House.

Among the bills which were passed were the Uttar Pradesh Public Health and Epidemic Disease Control Bill, 2020 and Cow-Slaughter Prevention (Amendment) Bill, 2020. The Uttar Pradesh Public Health and Epidemic Disease Control Bill 2020 aims at ensuring stricter punishment for those harassing coronavirus frontline workers, which includes doctors, paramedical staff, police personnel and sanitation personnel. Spitting on any worker is also considered an offence under this.

The Cow Slaughter Prevention (Amendment) Bill 2020 provides for stricter punishment for violators and permits the prosecution of the driver and owner of the vehicle used to carry a cow for the purpose of slaughter. It penalises cow slaughter with jail terms ranging from a minimum of one year to a maximum of 10 years and imposes monetary fine between Rs 3 lakh to Rs 5 lakh.
